Module 2: How to Teach With Focus

Religious belief isn't just rational; it is also deeply emotional. Module 3: How to Measure Learning

Module 4: How to Engage Your Students

Learn about active learning, how to use it to increase learning in your classroom, and take away a toolkit of learning activities ranging from simple engagement activities to more advanced analysis and performance activities, for large groups, small groups, and individuals.
